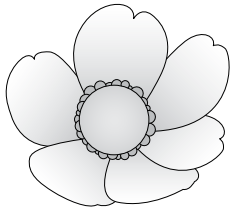


March Materials List

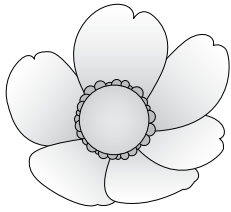
