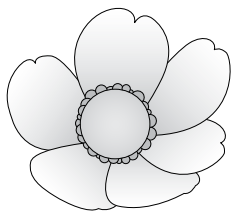


May Materials List

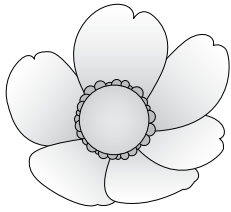
