## FAMILY CONNECTION

### Activities

#### Trains

Do you live near a train station or have to travel over tracks during your daily commute? Discuss trains and the train system with your child. What kind of cargo are the cars carrying? Where are the trains traveling to and coming from? If possible, visit a depot or museum with antique train cars or memorabilia.

#### • Holidays

Discuss the upcoming holidays with your child. Which holidays do you recognize or celebrate? Talk about your family traditions and what you will be doing to celebrate as a family this month. By the age of 4, children notice the cultural aspects of others' behavior, such as other children eating different foods and celebrating different holidays or none at all. Help your child become more accepting of cultural differences. Read books about different holidays and family experiences to your child.

### Recipe

#### **Gingerbread Playdough**

1 cup flour 3 T. each of ground cloves, allspice, cinnamon and ginger 1/2 cup salt 2 tsp. cream of tartar 1 cup water 1 tsp. vegetable oil

Mix dry ingredients together in a large bowl. Add the oil and water to the dry ingredients and mix. Dump the mixture into a large pot. Stir for two to three minutes,

while cooking over medium heat. Let cool. Roll out flat and use with cookie cutters.
