Learn with Me!

Sensory Walk

Engage in a sensory activity with your child. Plan a walk in your neighborhood or nearby park. As you walk, talk with your child about things you see, hear, and smell. What do you touch during the walk (e.g., a crosswalk button or tree bark)? Do you pack a snack or buy a treat to taste? Use descriptive language when talking about items (e.g., the birds are singing loudly, the bakery smells sweet, etc.). Notice what attracts your child's attention.

Yarn Snakes

Use yarn and scissors to make simple snakes with your child. Encourage your child to cut the yarn into different sizes. Make up a story about the snakes or sing a song while moving the snakes around. This easy activity is great for developing hand muscles and language skills.

My Project: Caterpillar to Butterfly

- Pretend to be butterflies.
- Read a story about butterflies.



My Project: Yarn Dabbing
