Learn with Me!

Purple Tent

Review the color purple with your child by creating a purple tent. Work together to collect purple sheets, blankets, or towels. Drape them over a table or chairs. Invite your child to lead the activity by choosing where the tent will go and what items to play with inside the tent.

Sidewalk Chalk Body Tracing

Help your child compare the sizes of different family members. Choose an area big enough to trace at least your and your child's body shape using sidewalk chalk. Trace your child's shape first and have your child trace your shape (or enlist the help of a friend or another family member). Once your body shapes are traced, use a measuring tape or other tool to measure your shapes. Which one is tallest? Which one is shortest? What other features can your child describe and appreciate about the body shapes?

Recipe

Frozen Banana Treats
