

## **Activities**

#### Visit a Pet Shop

Take your child to visit a pet shop to look at a variety of different pets. Look at the animals' habitats. How is each one designed specifically for each animal? For example, how is a bird's cage different from the cages the hamsters are in? How does your child think a fish can breathe underwater? What is required to take care of a cat or dog?

#### Unstructured Play

Foster and encourage your child's imagination and offer plenty of time for unstructured play, especially outdoors. Show enthusiasm and curiosity about your child's explorations. Make sure your child is safe, but refrain from negative reactions when he gets dirty, wet, or touches bugs, worms, etc. Bring nature items into your home, such as simple bouquets of flowers, leaves, or grass, and place them where your child can see them.

# Recipe

#### Garden Stew

1 lb. ground beef or turkey

1 onion, diced

3 potatoes, diced

3 carrots, diced

½ cup frozen green beans

1 cup frozen corn

4 cups water

½ tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. pepper

½ tsp. oregano

1 (15 oz.) can tomato sauce

Invite your child to help you make this stew to serve for dinner this week. Brown ground beef and onions. Drain. Add the remaining ingredients. Cook on medium heat for 20 minutes, and then simmer for 30 additional minutes or until vegetables are tender. Makes 6 servings.
